WHEREAS vide Urban Development and Municipal Affairs Department notification No. 607/MA/O/C-4/1A-20/2018 dated the 24th day of August, 2018 (hereinafter referred to as the said notification), the Board of Councillors of the Chandernagore Municipal Corporation in the district of Hooghly (hereinafter referred to as the said Corporation) has been dissolved for a period of six months from the date of issuance of the said notification in terms of sub-section (I) of section 60 of the West Bengal Municipal Corporation Act, 2006 (West Ben. Act XXXIX of 2006) (hereinafter referred to as the said Act) on the grounds as explained therein in the said notification;

AND WHEREAS for the purpose of ensuring the civic services in the area, the State Government vide Notification No. 608/MA/O/C4/IA-20/2018 dated the 24th day of August, 2018, has appointed the Commissioner, Chandernagore Municipal Corporation as such person in terms of clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 61of the said Act for exercising or performing all the powers and duties, which under provision of the said Act, any rule, regulation or by-law made thereunder may be exercised or performed by the Corporation or Mayor-in-Council or any Committee of the Corporation or Mayor, for a period of six months from the date of issuance of the said notification;

AND WHEREAS it is not possible to hold the general election of the said Corporation before expiry of six months;

AND WHEREAS in terms of third proviso under sub-section (2) of section 60 of the said Act, for any reason, it is not possible to hold the election before expiry of the period of six months under that sub-section, the State Government may extend the term of such person appointed under clause (b) of sub-section (1) of section 61 of the said Act, for a further period not exceeding six months;
