






CONTEXT

The Government of West Bengal has made huge investment in the Social Service, Agriculture & Allied Activities and Physical Infrastructure Sectors during the last decade.

Analysis of Government of West Bengal expenditure (in ₹ Cr.)







To complement the huge investment as above, Paray Samadhan has been launched to address neighborhood needs and gaps in infrastructure, trained manpower and supply of services. The objective is to create last mile infrastructure and optimally utilize existing infrastructure and improve the efficiency of service facilities. It is nearly impossible to identify such schemes without community participation.

Accordingly, these schemes were identified through Duare Sarkar camps and state grievance portal. In total 10180 schemes have been taken up under the campaign.

MISSION MODE APPROACH

Following strategy has been adopted in Paray Samadhan:

Identification of Issues in a Participatory Manner

Community level needs were collected at grassroot levels including the Duare Sarkar Camps.

2. **Field Verification and Feasibility Analysis**

After need identification, a feasibility and financial viability study was conducted through field visit to design the solution.

Monitoring and Execution 3.

A High-Level Task Force was set up to implement the government program by coordinating and monitoring the activities of District Magistrates (DM), Sub-Divisional Officers (SDO), Block Development Officers (BDO) and other Department officials for effective execution.

The Finance Department created an enabling condition by enhancing vetting powers of field engineers, relaxed tender timelines and enhanced delegated financial sanction limits of departments.

4. **Transparency**

A thread of seamless transparency runs through each stage of implementation. All the completed and ongoing schemes have been published on www.wb.gov.in. In addition, onsite wall writings for all schemes has been done and geo-tagged photographs have been uploaded.

5. Inter-Departmental Synergies

This unique initiative by the Government of West Bengal brought all the departments together and a synergy was witnessed which enabled fast-track execution and helped in improving the last mile delivery of services.

6. An IT-enabled Efficient Project Management System

The project management system in Paray Samadhan comprises an online portal with provision to upload geo-tagged photographs and videos and an executive dashboard. Real time data entry into the portal has helped in tracking the projects spread across the wide geographical area of the state.






CATEGORY WISE SCHEMES (IN NOS.)



SUB-CATEGORY WISE SCHEMES (IN NOS.)




SCHEME STATUS (IN NOS.)

Enhancing the technical vetting power of local engineering set-up and providing untied funds to districts has helped in resolving local needs quickly.



Description: The area adjoining a small rivulet was always under constant threat of getting submerged during rainy season and also once the level of water rises in the rivulet, the



embankments are not strong enough to hold on and might just bring the houses and other constructions at the bank down. This guard wall will now safeguard the habitation and constructions near the bank.

Description : People of Avasi Colony under Patchhara G.P., Cooch Behar-I Block had a long term demand for renovation of Pucca Drain at Avasi Colony due to water logging problem on their cultivated land, which was adversely affecting cultivation and had also become a nuisance for public health. The scheme was successfully completed as per guidelines of Paray Samadhan. This project has significantly improved the quality of life of people who live in this neighborhood.


bridge or take a longer route. Small businesses were also getting hampered. The bridge has now been repaired and local people are very pleased.



Patients who were more critical and needed to access Amta Rural Hospital (4kms away from the GP) used to depend on private mode of transport which was highly unpredictable thereby risking patient's well-being. The out of pocket expenditure was also very high (to the tune of Rs 500)



as these poor patients lacked negotiating power. An ambulance has been tagged to this area by the local authorities and people of the area are very pleased.
